STRUCTURE AND SUPPLY CHAINS

Andusia Holdings Ltd are experts within the waste recovery industry. Established in February 2012, Andusia's goal is to divert waste from UK landfill whilst generate combined heat and power (CHP) for local communities and businesses.

Andusia Holdings Ltd trade under three separate companies; Andusia Recovered Fuels Ltd represents the waste export business, Andusia Hazchem Treatment Ltd represents the hazardous waste treatment arm and Andusia Resource Recovery Ltd represents the growing UK RDF business.

The nature of our business requires that we work in conjunction with a range of suppliers. We hold strong established relationships with a supply base of professional UK waste management companies, a number of key international logistics providers and numerous Energy from Waste facilities across Europe.

MODERN SLAVERY ACT MEASURES

The following measures exist within our organisation in order to prevent slavery and human trafficking in its operations:

- Provide suitable training for relevant employees to equip them with the practical knowledge and information to act appropriately should they ever come into contact with any aspect of modern slavery
- Supplier contracts to include stipulations around anti-slavery and trafficking measures
